## **TEXT-T0-911**

Our Communications Center is responsible for answering 911 calls, dispatching police officers and CSOs, requesting fire department personnel and working with a variety of campus departments and outside agencies.

The newest addition to our dispatch capabilities is the Text-to-911 feature. In the event of an emergency, you can now Text-to-911 in Orange County if you're unable to speak or it isn't safe to do so.

While using the Text-to-911 feature, it is important to include your name, location and a brief description of your emergency. Please do not include photos or videos in your emergency text message.

In addition to taking 911 calls, our dispatchers receive all emergency blue phone and elevator entrapment phone calls and actively monitor video cameras situated throughout campus. Remember, if you see something, say something!

## K-9 TEAM

Have you met our K-9 Team? Officer Bauer and K-9 Glock have been a team since 2017. Glock is an Explosives Detection K-9, and he detects scents such as explosives, fireworks and dynamite.

The 3-year-old Labrador Retriever trained to be an Explosives Detection K-9 since he was only a few weeks old, and the training never ends. Officer Bauer and Glock have dedicated training days to keep Glock's odor detection skills in tip-top shape.

Glock patrols the CSUF campus to ensure the safety of the students, staff and faculty, but he is also utilized at other events such as concerts, dignitary protection and other CSU commencement ceremonies.

Glock is certified through the California Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST), the U.S. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (ATF) and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS).
