CSU FULLERTON POLICE DEPARTMENT GENERAL ORDER NUMBER 8-11

HOMELAND SECURITY

SUBJECT: Homeland Security involvement and activities.

PURPOSE: The purpose of this order is to provide guidelines for cooperation and

information sharing with other organizations to preempt terrorist acts or

events.

POLICY: It is the policy of this Department to participate in multi-jurisdictional

information sharing as part of Homeland Security efforts to prevent acts

of terrorism.

PROCEDURE:

I. Department Involvement [CALEA 46.3.1]

- A. The California State University, Fullerton Police Department is committed to participation in Federal, State, regional and local programs for information sharing between agencies as part of national homeland security.
- B. Liaison and Information Sharing—The Department will assign a Terrorism Liaison Officer (TLO) to the Orange County Terrorism Early Warning Group. [CALEA 46.3.2, 46.3.3]
- C. The designated Terrorism Liaison Officer is the agency representative to the Terrorism Early Warning Group (TEWG) and has the following responsibilities [CALEA 46.3.3]:
 - 1. Attending regular TEWG meetings. [CALEA 46.3.2]
 - 2. Collecting, reporting, retrieving and sharing of terrorism intelligence and materials related to terrorism. Such materials might include [CALEA 46.3.2]:
 - a. Training Bulletins
 - b. Information on schools and cases
 - c. Books, journals, periodicals and video tapes
 - d. Lists of official contacts
 - 3. Identifying and communicating with community stakeholders. The TLO shall review, filter and then forward relevant intelligence information to other agencies, University departments or individuals when and where appropriate. [CALEA 46.3.2]
 - 4. Conducting, coordinating and/or facilitating Departmental training with regard to terrorism and terrorist related subjects

- 5. Serving as the designated agency media representative and/or spokesperson with respect to terrorism related information
- D. If during the course of an investigation, Department investigators receive information that may potentially be terrorism related; they may contact the FBI representative to the Joint Terrorism Task Force and relay the information directly. [CALEA 46.3.2]
- II. Terrorism Training [CALEA 46.3.4]
 - A. All Police Officers will attend a Law Enforcement Response to Terrorism Incidents course. The course shall be California P.O.S.T. certified and designed for first responders.
 - B. The course should at a minimum provide training and awareness level guidelines for response to CBRN and hazardous material incidents. The course content will include the following:
 - 1. History of Terrorism
 - 2. Weapons of Mass Destruction
 - 3. ICS Basics
 - 4. First Responder Tasks and Duties
 - 5. Force Protection Operations
 - 6. Use of Protective Equipment (Level C bio-suits, APRs and Dosimeters)
 - 7. Mass Casualty/Decontamination Operations
- III. Equipment [CALEA 46.3.4]
 - A. All Police Officers below the rank of Lieutenant will be issued Level C bio-suits and Air Purifying Respirators (APR) upon completion of CBRN and hazardous material training.
 - B. The equipment will meet the minimum standards established by the Department of Homeland Security's Science and Technology Division.
